TICKETS: Series tickets for the Osher at Dartmouth Summer Lecture Series are now available for pick up in the Osher at Dartmouth office, or you may obtain your tickets at the first lecture you attend at the Spaulding Auditorium. Tickets will not be mailed. Staff will be at a table near door 1 after you walk up the stairs on the Spaulding Auditorium level. The first presentation is to be held on Thursday, July 13, starting at 9 a.m. We urge you to attend this first lecture, both because it promises to be important and because it will provide context for the entire series. You must have your ticket in hand as you enter the auditorium.

Series Ticket Holders: You will keep your ticket for the entire series. You must show your ticket at each lecture to the Osher at Dartmouth ushers, who will be located inside doors 2 and 3 of Spaulding. **If you lose your ticket**, you must visit the Osher at Dartmouth table at Spaulding and speak with a staff member to obtain a ticket for that day's lecture. (As series tickets will not be replaced, you will need to repeat this process for each individual lecture.) You will not be able to enter Spaulding without a ticket.

Single Session Tickets: You may purchase tickets at the Osher at Dartmouth table outside Spaulding Auditorium on the day of the lecture. You may also pre-purchase online via our website (osher.dartmouth.edu). **Pre-purchased tickets are issued only on a will call basis, and must be collected from the Osher at Dartmouth staff table outside Spaulding Auditorium the day of the lecture. Single session tickets are not issued in advance.** After receiving your ticket, you must **present it to the Osher at Dartmouth ushers**, who will be standing inside doors 2 and 3 as you enter Spaulding. You will not be allowed to enter Spaulding without presenting your ticket.

READING PACKETS: Reading packets contain articles and items recommended by several of our speakers. Packets are suggested reading rather than required, and are available digitally via our website (osher.dartmouth.edu). If you have difficulty with online reading, you can request a printed copy from the Osher at Dartmouth office. Please keep in mind that the printed version is black-and-white only, and requires 24 hours advance notice to prepare. Cost is \$5 for a printed copy; the online version is free.

PROGRAM BOOK: Program books will be available at Spaulding Auditorium at each lecture. The program book contains information about the series in general, about each lecturer and their topic, and will be available at no charge to all lecture attendees.

WEEKLY TIME FRAME: Each session of the series will run on Thursday mornings from 9:00 AM to 11:30 AM.

8:15 a.m. – 8:40 a.m. Ticketholders arriving prior to the doors opening is asked to form a line down the hallway from Spaulding Auditorium towards the Hopkins Center café. To avoid injury, we do not want anyone waiting on the stairs. To purchase tickets or pick up your day ticket, please visit the Osher at Dartmouth staff table.

8:40 a.m. The doors to Spaulding Auditorium will be open by this time to allow attendees ample opportunity to take your seats. As you enter the auditorium, you may see speakers running through their materials and mechanics. If so, please do not interrupt; allow them time to prepare. Show your ticket to the Osher at Dartmouth volunteer ushers inside the doors to the auditorium. You will also be given an index card so that you may write your question for the speaker. These cards will be collected at the break.

9:00 a.m. The program begins. Each lecture will be in two parts, each lasting approximately one hour.

Intermission: Approximately 10:00 to 10:30 a.m. A break period of 30 minutes, during which you are invited to the courtyard for refreshments and a chance to mingle with fellow audience members. The courtyard will fill to capacity, so we urge you to move quickly and efficiently. We will ring a bell after 20 minutes of the break, reminding you to return to your seats for the second half of the presentation.

10:30 – 11:30 a.m. Questions from the audience and responses with speaker.

11:30 a.m. Session concludes.

NOTE: If you leave early, we request that you sit in the back rows and exit quietly through the lobby, not the side doors. Exiting early is both a **distraction and an insult to our speakers**.

SPAULDING AUDITORIUM: Spaulding Auditorium is located in the Hopkins Center for the Arts, Dartmouth College at 12 Lebanon Street in Hanover, NH. You may enter Hopkins Center from Wheelock Street or Lebanon Street. Accessible entrance is on Lebanon Street. From Lebanon Street, enter through the double doors. There is an elevator to the right of the entrance. The elevator will bring you directly to door 4 of Spaulding. Please limit elevator use for those with limited mobility. A limited number of accessible seats are available to patrons with disabilities and their family or friends.

HEARING ASSISTANCE: Devices are available for Spaulding Auditorium. You may pick up a hearing assistance device in the Spaulding lobby from the Hopkins Center staff. If you borrow equipment from the Hopkins Center staff, please take personal responsibility for its return and integrity. The Hopkins Center staff may request IDs from anyone borrowing hearing assistance devices. Please be prepared to do so.
