PRESIDENT'S

REPORT

This year marks the 35th anniversary of the founding of our institute, which began in 1991 under the banner of ILEAD – the Institute for Lifelong Education at Dartmouth. While some things have changed over the last 35 years, not least our name, others remain the same, and together we continue to offer world-class educational opportunities for us all to engage with.

It is, therefore, an honor to be President of an institute with such a proud legacy, and time seems to have flown by as I now reach the end of the first year of my two-year term. Beverly Marshall has been on the Curriculum Committee since 2020. She sits on the Vetting sub-committee and is acting as Chair of that sub-committee for fall term courses.

As a Study Leader, Beverly has led 13 courses since the Winter Term of 2014. She skillfully coordinated a small group of fellow Study Leaders to offer the course “A Little of This and That” during Spring Term 2026.

As part of the Innovations Team (a working sub-group of the recently developed President’s Task Force, on which Beverly sits), she participates in brainstorming new ideas in attempts to attract new members to Osher.

Early in our 2025/26 year, Beverly reached out to past Study Leaders who have led movie-centric courses in order to schedule monthly movies to help celebrate Osher’s 35th year and bring members together for socializing.

Last year, along with Laney Sammons, Beverly created a spring gathering for anyone searching for information about being an Osher Study Leader. This was a perfect time to meet others who were interested and ask questions of experience Study Leaders.

Over the past few years, Beverly has served as the point of contact between the Osher office and new inquiries from parties interested in teaching at Osher at Dartmouth. When folks call or email the office to find out more about the ins/outs of being an Osher Study Leader, the staff passes their names on to Beverly, who then reaches out to chat about Osher and discuss what that individual wishes to offer in terms of a course.

In the words of Program Director Lisa King, "Beverly is very good at coordinating complex plans with others, and she has great ideas. She takes on a task and produces results."

Peter Paquette served as Osher at Dartmouth's President from July 2023 to June 2025. He previously served as Vice President, Treasurer, and is currently Chair of the Development Committee. Peter sits on the Leadership Council and is still active on both the Finance and Summer Lecture Series Committees.

Last year, despite still serving as President, Peter stepped up to chair the Summer Lecture Series Committee, as the previous chair had stepped down and the position was vacant. In an exchange of responsibilities, Peter handed over the role of committee Chair to Pete Bleyler, and took on Pete's former role of securing sponsorships for the Summer Lecture Series.

As Treasurer, Peter revamped our financial reporting with extensive details and consolidated information into two spreadsheets. This provided a concise but informative snapshot of previous year's activities, registration numbers, financial trends, and membership numbers.

In addition to volunteering on numerous committees, Peter taught two courses in the 2025 and 2026 Spring Terms.

CURRICULUM

HIGHLIGHTS

Throughout the year, the Curriculum Committee's five subcommittees work closely with Osher at Dartmouth staff and Study Leaders to develop and deliver an engaging, high-quality curriculum that reflects the interests of our members.

The Recruiting and Vetting subcommittees identify and encourage new and returning Study Leaders through the review and refining of course proposals. The Support subcommittee helps Study Leaders succeed in a variety of teaching formats, including in-person, Zoom, and HyFlex (virtual). The Reviewing subcommittee gathers and analyzes participant feedback to strengthen future offerings, and the Special Events subcommittee collaborates with staff to present lectures, discussions, and educational excursions that enrich the Osher experience.

During the 2025–2026 academic year, Osher at Dartmouth offered 163 courses led by 123 Study Leaders. We also expanded learning opportunities through more

than 50 shared courses offered in collaboration with other Osher programs, the National Resource Center for Osher Lifelong Learning Institutes, and Colby-Sawyer College's Adventures in Learning program. In addition, members enjoyed 19 special events, with more planned for the year ahead.

The success of these efforts depends on the dedication of our Study Leaders, volunteers, committee members, and staff. Together, they create a vibrant learning community that continues to thrive.

As we look ahead, we remain committed to maintaining the quality and breadth of our offerings while responding to changing member interests and an increasingly competitive landscape of online educational programs. To meet this challenge, we welcome new volunteers to join our subcommittees and help shape the future of Osher at Dartmouth.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS

This report cannot acknowledge all of our enthusiastic Study Leaders and lecturers by name. However, this report lists the dedicated individuals who currently serve on the full Curriculum Committee (CC) and its five subcommittees.

RECRUITING

The mission of the Recruiting Subcommittee is to identify and reach out to potential and seasoned Study Leaders and invite them to offer new courses for Osher at Dartmouth. Recruiters are most active during three brief periods each year as they prepare for the fall, winter, and spring terms.

VETTING

The mission of the Vetting Subcommittee is to review and approve course proposals. This process often involves substantial collaboration with Study Leaders, particularly in refining course descriptions and strengthening proposals.

The vetting process typically lasts four to five weeks. It begins one to ten days before the proposal deadline, allowing reviewers to get a head start on early submissions, and continues for two to three weeks after the deadline, depending on proposal volume.

Following the academic schedule, the annual vetting schedule is generally as follows:

- Winter Term: Late August through September
- Spring Term: Mid- to late November through early January (extended by holiday schedules)
- Fall Term: Mid-May through June

Fall is typically the busiest proposal season, followed closely by winter and then spring. Across all terms we had 163 courses approved, taught by 123 Study Leaders, of which 14 were new to Osher At Dartmouth.

SUPPORT

The mission of the Support subcommittee is to help Study Leaders design, prepare, and deliver courses to the Osher at Dartmouth community. The Support subcommittee can assist in many ways:

- Help develop an idea into a formal proposal
- Advise on the design of a course outline or syllabus
- Be a sounding board in organizing content and building slides for class sessions
- Share best teaching practices, especially when teaching via Zoom and HyFlex
- Brainstorm strategies for encouraging discussion among participants

Before each term begins, the Subcommittee provides an orientation session for new Study Leaders, with returning Study Leaders invited to join in and share their experience. At the orientation, Study Leaders ask questions and learn about the teaching, classroom management, and technology resources available to support them. Support also offers mentoring to Study Leaders and especially to new Study Leaders before and during the course. Mentors have experience leading courses and volunteer to work with individuals seeking advice as they prepare for and teach their course.

At the close of each term, a debrief session for all Study Leaders is offered. At the debrief session, Study Leaders can share best practices and teaching tips, provide feedback about what has and hasn't worked, and discuss ideas for improvements.

DIGITAL HANDBOOK

The "Study Leaders" section of the Osher at Dartmouth website is available anytime to answer questions about "How It All Works." There, one can learn about how to propose, design, and lead a course. Together, the Support subcommittee and the Office continually work to update, improve, and enhance this web resource. The Support subcommittee and the Office also work to assist Study Leaders who wish to present their courses virtually via our

HyFlex capability. We have designed a HyFlex guidebook, we provide effective, enjoyable HyFlex training sessions, and we clarify the roles of the Class Representative (who helps in the classroom) and the Class Monitor (who helps on-line with Zoom and HyFlex courses).

REVIEWING

The mission of the Reviewing subcommittee is to receive and analyze the feedback forms completed by course participants at the end of each Osher term, and to communicate to the other subcommittees where there are areas of successful course delivery and areas where problems need to be addressed.

At the finish of each term, participants in Osher courses are asked to fill out an anonymous online feedback form and submit it to the Osher office. Participants can check off the appropriate boxes for each simple question as well as expand their choices with written reflections. The feedback forms from the participants are looked at by the Osher staff, shared with the appropriate Study Leaders, and apportioned out to the Reviewing subcommittee members for overall assessment.

Our recently improved review process has led to more course participants completing their feedback forms, Study Leaders receiving that feedback within two weeks of the close of their course, more effective collaboration with the Vetting and Support subcommittees, as well as providing the Recruiting subcommittee with suggested new Study Leaders and new course topics.

SPECIAL EVENTS

The mission of the Special Events subcommittee is to provide Osher members and their guests with Special Lectures (in classrooms or online), with in-person Hot Plates/Hot Topics (luncheon lectures), and with course-related travel to venues that offer historical, musical, and artistic programs locally.

Throughout the past year, the Special Events subcommittee has worked closely with the Office staff to initiate, plan, and guide along half a dozen Special Lectures and webinars, five Hot Plates/Hot Topics, and eight course-related trips. All of these events are well attended, bringing engaging learning experiences to speakers, guides, and participants. They also create enriched social connections. And they provide links to new speakers for Special Lectures and Hot Plates/Hot Topics, as well as new Study Leaders who could propose interesting course topics.

CHALLENGE AND OPPORTUNITY

Our courses and special events continue to be of exceptionally high quality. At the same time, we face increasing competition from web-based and in-person programs offered by local and national organizations. To share the Osher experience and to respond effectively to today's opportunities and challenges, our subcommittees welcome new volunteers.

DEVELOPMENT

In September 2024, Dartmouth College gave permission to the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at Dartmouth (Osher) to establish an endowment fund for the benefit of Osher (the fund). The fund had an initial donation target of \$100,000.

In order to raise the targeted donations, the Leadership Council changed its By-Laws effective December 12, 2024, and established the Development Committee. Per the By-Laws, the Development Committee:

“...is responsible for all fund raising. This includes the annual Friends of Osher campaign and all fundraising activities related to the Fund for Osher at Dartmouth, which may become the Endowment Fund for Osher at Dartmouth. It is also responsible for securing sponsorships and alternate funding sources for Osher at Dartmouth.”

Although responsible for raising funds for the Friends of Osher, the Development Committee has focused its fundraising efforts in fiscal 2025 and 2026 on the fund. As of November 2025, the fund

achieved its initial donation goal of \$100,000. And, as of April 30, 2026, the fund has received \$140,000 of donations.

Regarding fiscal 2027, the Development Committee will coordinate with Dartmouth Advancement and the Provost's Office to execute a fund-raising effort in the fall of 2026 to raise additional funds for the fund.

In addition, the Development Committee has been working diligently regarding sponsorships for fiscal 2027 and has achieved sponsorship commitments of \$42K towards its fiscal 2027 goal of \$45K. The Development Committee believes that the remaining \$3K can be achieved through advertisements in various Osher publications. Please contact the chair if you can provide any help with the solicitation of advertising monies.

On behalf of Osher, thank you to everyone who donated to the fund and to the companies that committed to sponsoring fiscal 2027.

FINANCE

As before, this annual report is being written in Early June, prior to our year end of 6/30/26. The narrative here is based on ten months of financial information. Based on last year's experience we budgeted for a significant loss this year (low six figures). While we are experiencing losses this year (high five figures), we will improve on our budget by 30%. This loss will be funded through our non-endowment reserve funds.

These non-endowment reserves (Molloy Fund, Friends of Osher Fund, and Operating Reserve Fund) remain strong, as does the Osher Endowment Fund which is managed by the investment office at Dartmouth College.

On the fund-raising side, O@D has been chosen for endowment distributions from the newly formed William C. Scott Endowment. Additionally, our newly formed Fund for Osher at Dartmouth has had initial success and will be important as it grows and supports our operating costs.

We are forecasting 1215 members at year-end. The Membership

Next year's budget (FY'27) again shows a loss, however, at half the size of our current year's budget. This is a positive move, and we need to do the work to continue this trend.

GOVERNANCE

The Governance Committee is charged with evaluating the leadership structure, maintaining focus on succession planning, and fostering member participation in the governance of the organization. This past year the committee instituted a changed leadership structure that refined the length of service for both President and Vice President, creating a more flexible process. The President now serves two years in that role and may serve up to two years as Vice President. Iain Sim has completed his first term as President after serving nearly a year as Vice President. We are currently seeking a Vice President who would be interested in serving up to a year as Vice President before assuming the presidency for two years.

Concerned that members may not be aware of the various leadership opportunities available at Osher, the committee sponsored articles in the quarterly newsletter that highlighted the (very simple) process for volunteering and featured comments from several

members on why they serve. Opportunities include membership in one of the seven standing committees or serving on the Leadership Council. A separate brochure, available in the Osher office and classrooms, describes the multiple contributions to Osher's welfare that Leadership Council membership makes possible.

Each year members are asked to elect four individuals to serve on the Leadership Council. The Governance Committee oversees this process. The Committee followed last year's revised process for electing new Council members. While encouraging the usual process of member-petitioned candidates through multiple announcements in the weekly and quarterly newsletters, the Committee also undertook to identify four persons whom it judged would add value to the Leadership Council. As was true the previous year, no member-petitioned candidates emerged. Fortunately we did have a strong slate of Council members elected for a term of three years: Jim Dunaway, Cam Moore and Susan McCaslin (serving second terms) and Betsy Eccles (serving a first term).

Talented volunteers are key to the success of Osher at Dartmouth. It is the happy responsibility of the Governance Committee to identify two very worthy individuals whose contributions to the organization are legion. The award this year goes to Beverly Marshall and Peter Paquette.

SUMMER LECTURE SERIES

Planning for the 2026 Summer Lecture Series (SLS) began in late August, soon after the end of the 2025 Series. After healthy debate, it was decided to focus on Artificial Intelligence. Not only did it seem a timely topic, but 2026 represents the 70th year since the 1956 Dartmouth conference devoted to machine learning, which came up with the term “artificial intelligence,” and Dartmouth is planning its own celebration this year.

While our budget anticipated no increase in attendance over the six sessions, the Committee adopted an informal goal of increasing attendance by 10%.

Besides the usual fine marketing and publicity campaign led by Sarah Chamberlin, we organized a number of new initiatives to stimulate attendance.

First, we announced the theme for the Series in early January, “How is Artificial Intelligence Transforming America?” Since we had recruited all six of our speakers by the beginning of the year, we asked

them to suggest books that our prospective audience might read before the Series began, to assist them in getting more knowledgeable about the topic. These book titles and authors are posted on the Osher website.

Another initiative was to contact the school districts in the Upper Valley and offer discounts to teachers for the Series, and to provide recertification credits for their professional growth.

A Hood Museum companion workshop on July 23 was announced, which will explore the museum's exhibits highlighting the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence and connections to Artificial Intelligence. Only Series pass holders will be eligible to attend.

Deb Springhorn, a member of the SLS committee, wrote an op-ed article on Artificial Intelligence for the *Valley News*, which also included information about the Osher Summer Lecture Series.

Lastly, we held a "Prologue" lecture about AI and Osher's Summer Lecture Series in early June. Chris Jernstedt, a retired Dartmouth professor and AI authority, delivered a stunning presentation.

By the middle of August, we'll find out how we did with our attendance.
